# International Passenger Growth at KIX Expected to be 7% Over New Year Holiday - Highest Ever Daily Passenger Average -

Congestion Expected, Passengers Advised to Arrive Early; Take Public Transport

Kansai Airports announces 7% growth in passengers on international flights at Kansai International Airport (KIX) expected during the 2016 New Year holiday.

The New Year holiday period for this year is 13 days starting from December 22 (Thu) 2016, ending on January 3 (Tue) 2017.

The total number of passengers on international flights at KIX during this New Year holiday period is estimated to be 702,200, a daily average of 54,000 which represents 7% growth over the previous year. This will be the highest daily average record ever for the airport. (Previously, 2015 saw the highest daily average of 50,290.)

The number of departing passengers is estimated at 369,300 (9% growth over the previous year) whilst the number of arrival passengers is estimated at 332,900 (representing a 6% growth over the previous year). South Korea, China and Taiwan are the top three destinations in terms of departing passenger numbers.

During the New Year holiday, Kansai Airports foresees increased congestion at KIX, especially at the security check area. Passengers are strongly advised to check earlier than normal during this busy period. In addition, the parking area is also expected to be crowded, so travelers are advised to take advantage of the convenient public transport connections to the airport.
