Kansai International Airport New Terminal 2 Opens on January 28

– Enhancing Traveler's Experience with Exciting Stores –

Kansai Airports announced that it will open the Terminal 2 International on January 28, 2017.

Throughout Terminal 2 a variety of services will be available including ATMs, foreign currency exchange, and traveler's insurance vending machines in addition to stores and restaurants.

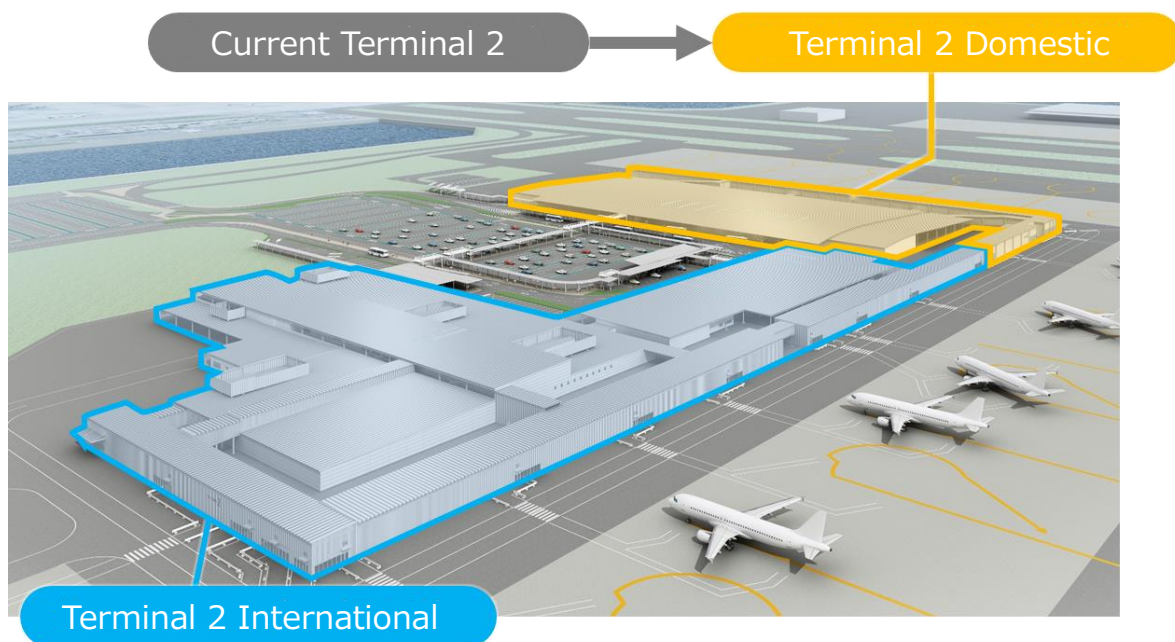
The retail stores will feature walk-through style duty-free shopping for the first time at an airport in Japan. Large-scale shops featuring products popular with travelers such as cosmetics, confectioneries, electrical appliances, tobacco, and many others will be arranged along a main aisle to make it easier for customers to choose their favorite products. A number of specialty shops popular among Chinese customers such as drug stores and stores selling watches are also included.

Two restaurants featuring "Japanese" and "Kansai Area" specialty dishes are included in the new Terminal. A variety of restaurants feature a rich assortment of menu items which will cater for the great number of customers and travelers who visit and use the airport.

Terminal 2 will provide comfortable and convenient experiences through its variety of shops and services.

*The total floor space of shopping area (such as duty free, retail and food and beverage stores) is 1,640 square meters, in which walk-through style duty-free shopping area covers 1,090 square meters of floor space.

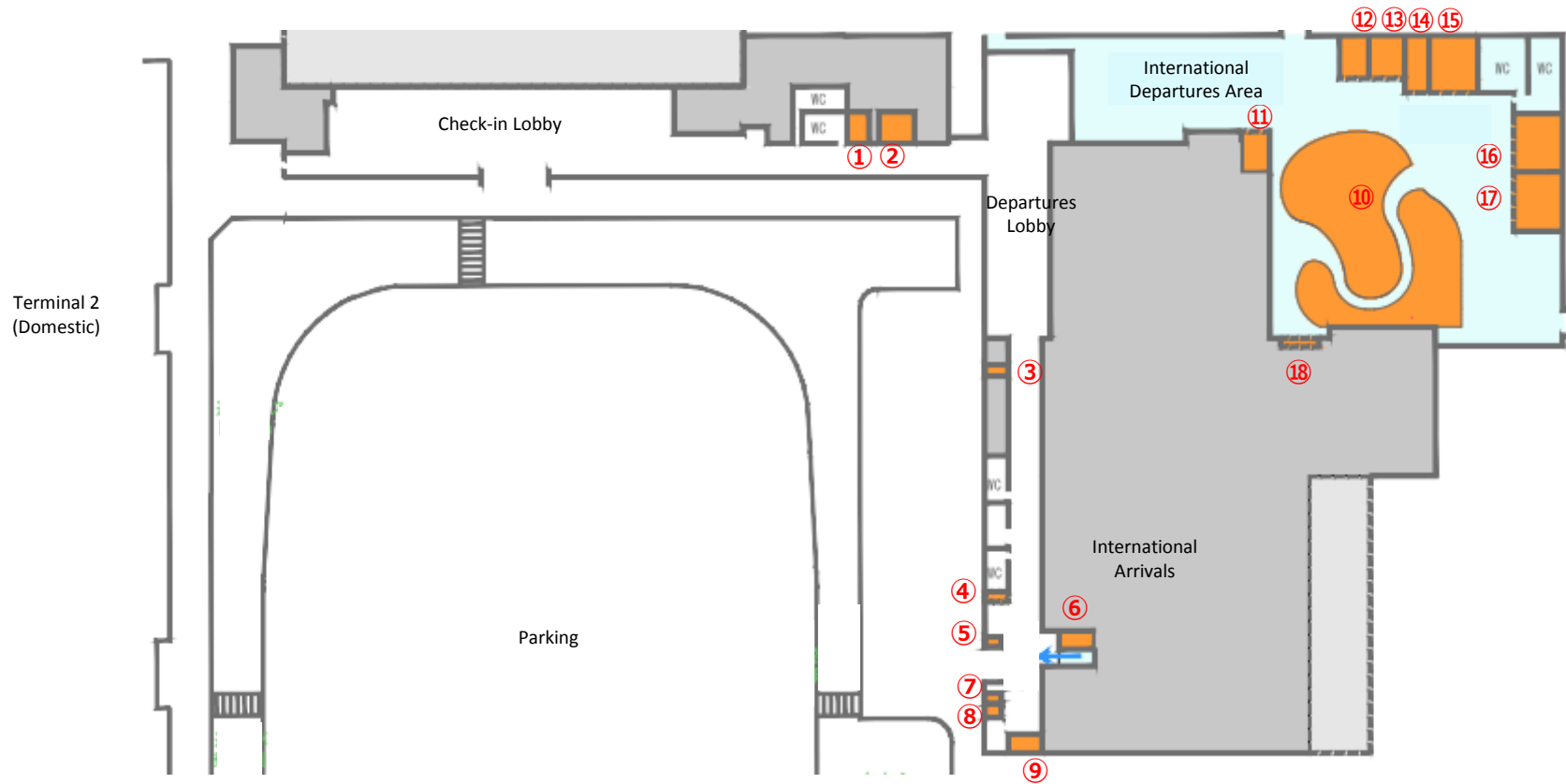
Terminal 2 Layout

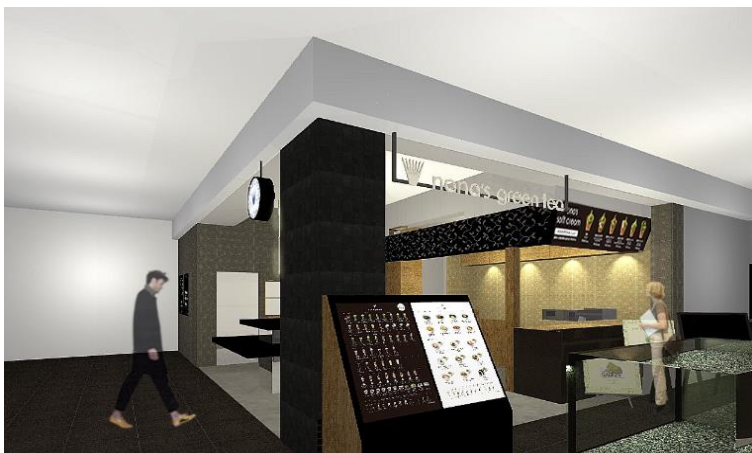
