To accommodate increasing access from smartphones, we adopted a “responsive web design” that allows a website to automatically optimize the size of the screen it’s being viewed on. Moreover, searching enhancements enable users to search flight options and book and buy tickets through our websites, as well as to search routes for public transportation.

The sites were designed to show frequently-viewed information in more intuitive and simple ways. Over 60 percent of our website viewers access our sites from their smartphones or tablets. In view of this, we have adopted a “responsive web design” that allows a website to automatically optimize the size of the screen it’s being viewed on, thereby delivering uniform contents to PC and mobile users.

Furthermore, we have partnered with Skyscanner to offer flight search and booking services through our sites.

The new sites support full-text searching in addition to genre- and preference-based searches, enabling users to find merchandise by product or brand name.

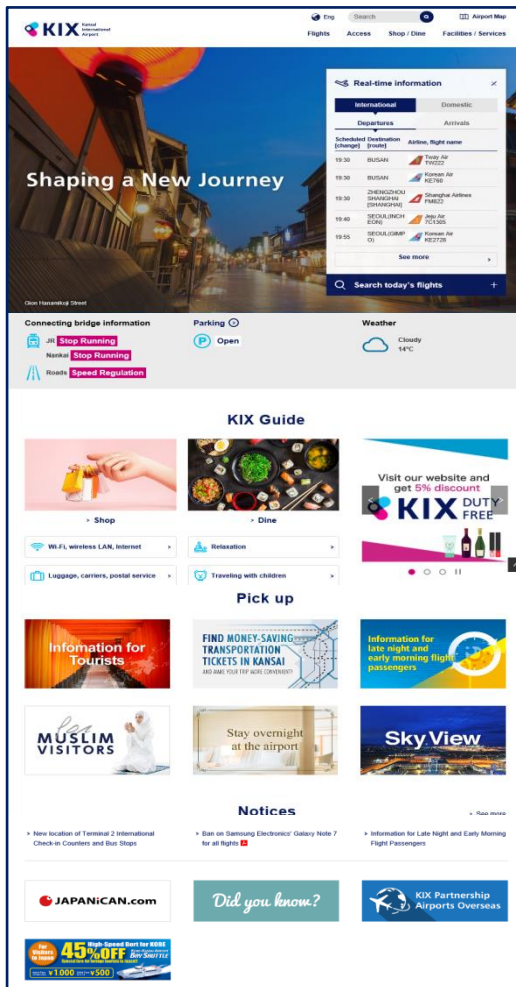
- In view of their public nature, the new sites are designed with a focus on web accessibility.

* What is Web Accessibility?

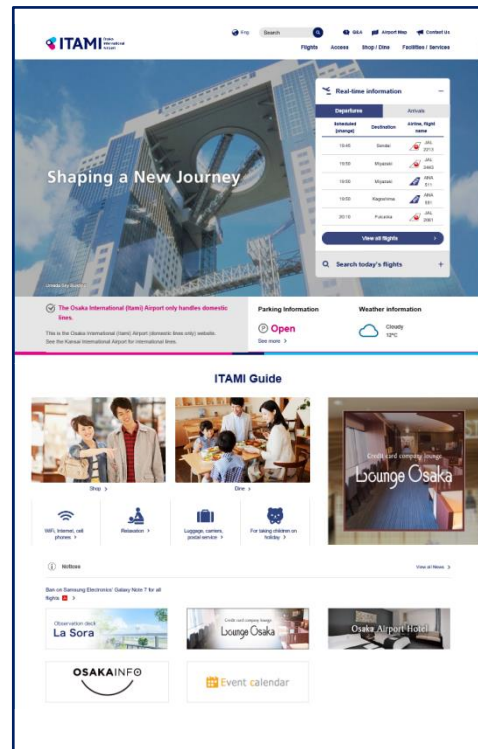
“To make the website accessible to anyone from anywhere”

As of April 1, 2016, Kansai Airports succeeded the operating rights of Kansai International Airport ("KIX") and Osaka International Airport ("ITAMI") from New Kansai International Airport Company ("NKIAC") and commenced business as an operating company for the two airports. Kansai Airports was established by a consortium made up of VINCI Airports and ORIX Corporation as its core members. Kansai Airports shares the common goal of maximizing the potential of the Kansai International Airport and Osaka International Airport, improving services to passengers and ensuring the highest levels of safety and security, investment to enhance safety, convenience and comfort to increase value, as well as enhancing community relations in the neighborhoods of the airports and benefiting the Kansai regional economy. On December 15, Kansai Airports signed a concession contract with the New Kansai International Airport Company ("NKIAC") for an operating period of 44-years.
