

## Recovery status related to Typhoon Jebi (as of September 16, 2018)

[Flights] (as of 16:00 on September 16)

- Status of flights for September 16
  - [Int'l total] 61 flights, 121 movements (35%)
  - [Domestic total] 46 flights, 91 movements (70%)
  - [Total] 107 flights, 212 movements (44%)
- T1 International: 30 airlines (44%) 48 flights, 95 movements (30%)  
Domestic: 6 airlines (100%) 24 flights, 47 movements (55%)
- T2 International: 2 airlines (100%) 13 flights, 26 movements (87%)  
Domestic: 1 airline (100%) 22 flights, 44 movements (100%)
  
- Flights scheduled for September 17
  - [Int'l total] 68 flights, 136 movements (39%)
  - [Domestic total] 46 flights, 91 movements (70%)
  - [Total] 114 flights, 227 movements (47%)
- T1 International: 35 airlines (61%) 54 flights, 108 movements (34%)  
Domestic: 6 airlines (100%) 24 flights, 47 movements (55%)
- T2 International: 2 airlines (100%) 14 flights, 28 movements (93%)  
Domestic: 1 airline (100%) 22 flights, 44 movements (100%)

\* Flight operations from September 16 to 20 are subject to change depending on airlines' schedules.

\* **The flight schedule will be back to normal on September 21.**

Note: "Back to normal" means our operational readiness will be ensured and the pre-typhoon flight plan will be applied, but please be aware that this doesn't mean all flights will be served. As flight operations are subject to change, passengers are advised to check the latest flight information on their airline's website.

[Runway]

- Runway A is used for departures and Runway B for arrivals.

[Stands]

- Terminal 1: 22 out of 26 stands to be used  
\*26 (No. 16 - 41) out of total 41 stands are currently available
- Terminal 2: 18 out of 20 stands to be used

[Terminal 1]

- No major troubles. Efforts are underway to restore power, PBBs and BHS in the northern area of T1.
- 113 out of 152 stores/restaurants (74%) in the southern part of T1 reopened.  
\*Operating hours and offers at some stores/restaurants are limited.

[Access]

- **Rail services between Rinku-Town Sta. and KIX (JR & Nankai) will resume on September 18.**
- **With the restart of rail access, the shuttle bus service between Rinku-Town Sta. and KIX will end on September 17.**

Access status as of September 16:

- Private and rental cars are still not allowed on the access bridge. No heavy traffic congestion was observed today.
- JR and Nankai train services are offered to/from Rinku Town Station.
- Special shuttle buses are available between Rinku Town Sta. and KIX from 5:00 to 24:00 (Note this service will end on September 17)

- Limousine bus services are currently provided by bus operators on 24 out of 25 routes.  
\*Except for the Koyasan route. The number of services is reduced on some routes.
  - Kobe-KIX Bay Shuttle, a high-speed ferry, is running normally.  
\*Additional ferry services are available depending on the occupancy of scheduled services (max 12 round trips).
  - 258 cars are still left in car parks at KIX (initially approx. 4,000 cars).
