

Recovery status related to Typhoon Jebi (as of September 14, 2018)

[Flights]

- Status of flights as of 18:00 on September 14

T1 International flight:	25 airlines (44%)	40 flights	80 movements (26%)

[Runway A]

Runway A is used for arrivals and Runway B for departures. The runways are equally used (50:50).

*The first flight, cargo aircraft (FedEx), used Runway A at around 1:30.

[Stands]

- Terminal 1: 24 out of 26 stands opened
*26 (No. 16 – 41) out of total 41 stands are currently available.
- Terminal 2: 18 out of 20 stands opened

[Terminal 1]

- The southern part of T1 opened as scheduled with no major troubles.
- Efforts are underway to restore power, PBBs and BHS in the northern part of T1.
- 76 out of 135 stores/restaurants (56%) reopened in part of T1.
*Operating hours and offers at some stores are limited.

[Access]

- Private and rental cars are still not allowed on the access bridge. No heavy traffic congestion was observed today.
- JR and Nankai train services have been offered to/from Rinku Town Station.
- Special shuttle buses have been available between Rinku Town Station and KIX from 5:00 to 24:00.
- Limousine bus services are currently provided by bus operators on 24 out of 25 routes.
*Except for Koyasan (Mount Kōya) route. The number of bus services is reduced on some routes.
- Kobe-KIX Bay Shuttle, a high-speed ferry, is running normally.
*Additional ferry services are available depending on the occupancy of scheduled services (max 12 round trips).
- 361 cars are still left in car parks at KIX (initially approx. 4,000 cars).
