### [Terminal 1]

- No major troubles. Efforts are underway to restore power and BHS in the northern area.
- 128 out of 152 stores/restaurants (84%) reopened.
  - \*Operating hours and offers at some stores/restaurants are limited.

### [Access]

- Rail services (JR & Nankai) between Rinku-Town Sta. and KIX resumed on September 18.
- With the restart of rail access, the free shuttle bus service between Rinku-Town Sta. and KIX ended on September 17.

Access status as of September 18:

- Private and rental cars are still not allowed on the access bridge. No heavy traffic congestion was observed today.
- Normal operation of JR and Nankai train services to and from KIX resumed.
- Limousine bus services are currently provided by bus operators on 24 out of 25 routes. \*Except for the Koyasan route. The number of services is reduced on some routes.

- Kobe-KIX Bay Shuttle, a high-speed ferry, is running normally.
