

## **Results of FY2018 Employee Survey at ITAMI and KOBE**

Kansai Airports today announced the results of employee surveys taken at Osaka International Airport (ITAMI) and Kobe Airport (KOBE). The previous survey was taken in FY2014 at ITAMI whereas this was the first survey conducted at KOBE.

Kansai Airports is committed to revitalizing the Kansai region and Japan by expanding air traffic demand and creating more job opportunities at the airport.

### Method

A survey questionnaire designed to obtain key data including the number of employees working at ITAMI and KOBE

### • Respondents

On-airport operators whose offices or outlets are located at ITAMI or KOBE as of December 1, 2018.

### • Objective

To use the data as reference for emergency response to a crisis such as a large-scale disaster or an epidemic as well as for the improvement of employee support

### Results

[ITAMI]

- Organizations: 112 (+26, up 30% from the previous survey)
- Employees: 5,980 (+1,070, up 22% from the previous survey)

[KOBE]

- Organizations: 34 (First survey with no past survey available to compare)
- Employees: 1,069 (First survey with no past survey available to compare)

#### Summary

[ITAMI]

The number of both on-airport operators and employees at ITAMI increased from the previous survey taken in November 2014, mainly attributable to the terminal renovation and growing passenger numbers.

#### [KOBE]

This comprehensive employee survey was carried out at KOBE for the first time. The results of the survey indicated there were 34 on-airport operators and 1,069 employees working at KOBE.

The number of both on-airport operators and employees at ITAMI increased from the previous survey taken in November 2014, mainly attributable to the terminal renovation and growing passenger numbers










# Work locations at ITAMI






