

# ITAMI grand re-opening on August 5, 2020 New and more exciting airport experience for all visitors

Kansai Airports is delighted to announce that it will re-open the North and South terminal buildings of Osaka International Airport (ITAMI) on August 5, 2020.

Since February 2016, ITAMI has undergone the first major renovation in about 50 years. Following the pre-opening of the central and rooftop areas in April 2018, this grand re-opening unveils new departure areas in the North and South Terminals.

While the schedule was revised from the originally planned July opening date, the renovation plan remains unchanged. The Retail Zone will open post-security in both terminals, introducing Japan's first walk-through commercial space in the domestic gate area. This will provide customers with a unique experience of walking around while enjoying shopping.

The Food & Beverage Zone, leading from the Retail Zone, will have an open space at its center equipped with tables and chairs where you can eat, relax, and do your work. With this reopening, ITAMI will have a total of 31 new stores post-security, offering Kansai-inspired products and experiences exclusive to the airport.

Pre-security, five new stores are opening up, which will transform ITAMI to an attractive spot to drop by not only for passengers but also for local residents and leisure and business travelers who happen to be in Osaka.

Kansai Airports will continue to develop more exciting facilities to deliver a comfortable and enjoyable travel experience for all airport guests.
