



Runway Walk to be held at KIX as part of 2021 Sky Day & Sky Season - First ever runway walk event on Runway A -

The KIX Sky Day and Sky Season Committee and Kansai Airports today announced that the 2021 KIX Runway Walk will be held at Kansai International Airport (KIX) on November 21. This special event, taking place as part of the nation's annual Sky Day and Sky Season, is intended to encourage elementary and junior high school students and their guardians to explore the airport and learn about aviation.

In the event, attendees will be given a rare opportunity to walk on the airport runway, which is usually off-limits to the public, and see parked planes, airfield lights and airport fire engines up close. It will be the first runway walk event at KIX in 14 years since 2007 before the opening of the airport's Runway B. What is more, Runway A will be the venue for the runway walk for the first time since the establishment of the airport. We hope that participants will deepen their understanding of the airport and aviation. By promoting fun and enjoyable events, Kansai Airports Group will continue to deliver the attractiveness of airports and offer an exciting travel experience for all airport guests, including residents in local communities.
