To contribute to a sustainable society through operations of public infrastructure, the airports.

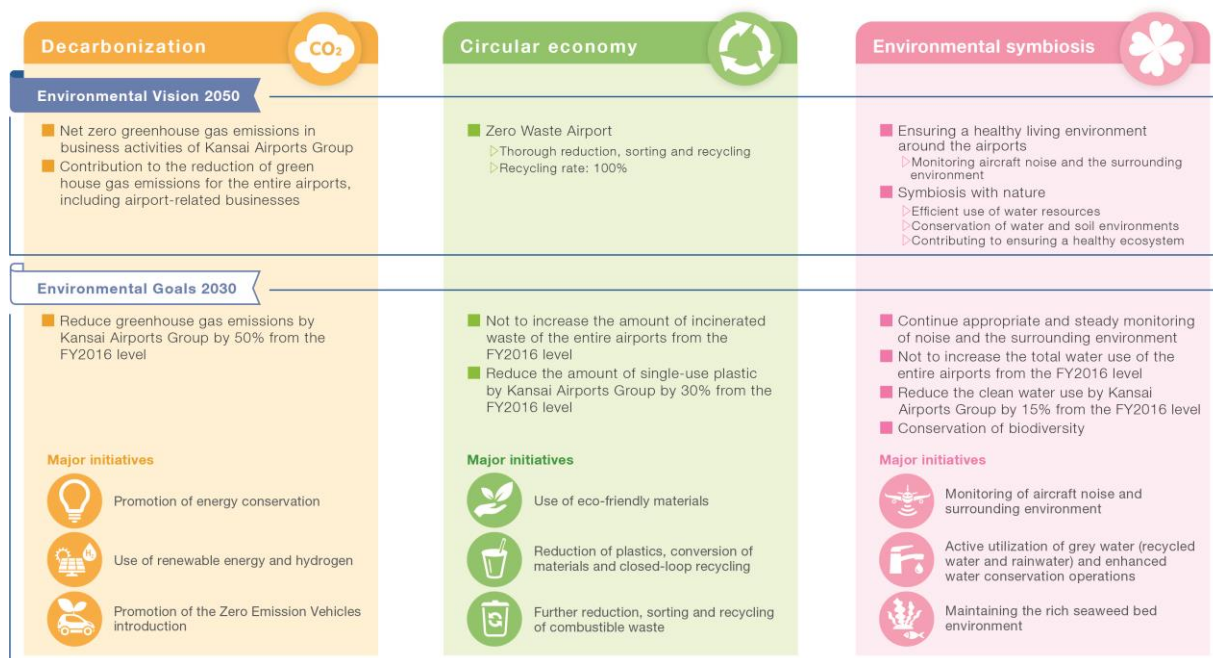
Kansai Airports Group is delighted to announce the launch of our new environmental plan in April 2023 at our 3 Kansai airports (Kansai International Airport, Osaka International Airport, and Kobe Airport), aimed at reducing our environmental impact.

We, Kansai Airports Group, have been actively working on reducing our environmental impact at the 3 airports we operate. We formulated the Environmental Vision 2050 and Environmental Goals 2030 to recognize once again the importance of solving environmental issues on a global scale, such as by decarbonization, and to not only continue the existing plans but also further advance them. With decarbonization, circular economy, and environmental symbiosis as the 3 pillars, we have set our long-term vision as well as the specific goals toward the milestone, 2030.

Kansai Airports Group will continue to take united actions to reduce our environmental impact and to contribute to a sustainable society through the operations of the airports as a public infrastructure.

Key points of the new plan

- The total management with the focus not only on reducing greenhouse gases (GHGs) but also on contributing to resource circulation, environmental monitoring and biodiversity
- Our vision to reduce GHG emissions, including emissions in Scope 3, in which Kansai Airports Group is directly involved.
- Raising our GHG emission reduction targets in Scope 1 and 2 for FY2030 (from 40% reduction to 50% reduction compared to the FY2016 levels).
- Zero Waste Airport Vision to achieve the waste recycling rate of 100%.
- Reinforcement of the system to propel environmental activities.

We have formulated **Kansai Airports Group Environmental Vision 2050** building on our **Environmental Philosophy** and **Basic Environmental Policy**.

We have also set the **Environmental Goals 2030**, our action plans towards FY2030 goals, under the Environmental Vision 2050.

Environmental Philosophy

We, Kansai Airports Group, recognize the importance of solving environmental problems on a global scale and contribute to the realization of a sustainable society through the operation of airports, which are public infrastructure.

Basic Environmental Policy

- Each employee of the group will diligently preserve the global environment in their daily work.
- We will clarify the environmental impact of our business activities, set goals to reduce it, and take proactive measures.
- We will regularly check on the progress of initiatives and work to improve the content.
- We will play a pioneering role in the airport field. Furthermore, we will contribute to reducing the environmental burden by overall airports, including the aviation sector.
- We will communicate with all stakeholders involved in airports and communities.

Environmental Management

• Environmental Promotion Structure

Kansai Airports Group has established an environmental promotion system to promote group-wide environmental activities. Under the Group Environmental Promotion Committee (chaired by the CEO and Co-CEO), which consists of the heads of divisions and group companies, each division and group company implements the action plans it has formulated and regularly assesses and reports on them to improve its initiatives.

We are also promoting environmental initiatives in cooperation with airport-related businesses through the Airport Environmental Promotion Councils of the three airports and the Airport Decarbonization Promotion Councils established by the airport administrator.

• Raise awareness

Environmental training will be conducted for all employees in order to foster a culture in which each employee diligently self-improves and promotes environmental initiatives in their daily work.

• Acquire a certification

Our progress will be reviewed by utilizing third-party verification, while aligning with our goals.



Environmental Vision 2050 and Environmental Goals 2030

We are now facing various ever-growing environmental issues such as climate change and depletion of energy and resources. Kansai Airports Group, through airport operations, contributes to a decarbonized society, a circular society, and an environmental symbiosis society that is in harmony with nature and local communities.

The "Environmental Vision 2050" sets the long-term vision of the Kansai Airports Group, while the "Environmental Goals 2030" sets specific milestone targets for achieving the vision.

Zero Waste Airport

- ▷ Thorough reduction, sorting and recycling
- ▷ Recycling rate: 100%

- Not to increase the amount of incinerated waste of the entire airports from the FY2016 level
- Reduce the amount of single-use plastic by Kansai Airports Group by 30% from the FY2016 level

Major initiatives

- Use of eco-friendly materials
- Reduction of plastics, conversion of materials and closed-loop recycling
- Further reduction, sorting and recycling of combustible waste

Environmental symbiosis



- Ensuring a healthy living environment around the airports
 - ▷ Monitoring aircraft noise and the surrounding environment
- Symbiosis with nature
 - ▷ Efficient use of water resources
 - ▷ Conservation of water and soil environments
 - ▷ Contributing to ensuring a healthy ecosystem

- Continue appropriate and steady monitoring of noise and the surrounding environment
- Not to increase the total water use of the entire airports from the FY2016 level
- Reduce the clean water use by Kansai Airports Group by 15% from the FY2016 level
- Conservation of biodiversity

Major initiatives

- Monitoring of aircraft noise and surrounding environment
- Active utilization of grey water (recycled water and rainwater) and enhanced water conservation operations
- Maintaining the rich seaweed bed environment



Kansai Airports was established by a consortium made up of VINCI Airports and ORIX Corporation as its core members. Kansai Airports took over the operations of Kansai International Airport (“KIX”) and Osaka International Airport (“ITAMI”) from New Kansai International Airport Company (“NKIAC”) and has been operating the two airports since April 1, 2016.

Kansai Airports Kobe, Kansai Airports’ wholly-owned subsidiary, took over the operations of Kobe Airport (“KOBE”) from Kobe City and started its business as an operating company on April 1, 2018.

Under the concept of “One Kansai Airports Group”, Kansai Airports group strives to continuously improve its services for all airport guests through appropriate investments and efficient operations, with safety and security being the top priority. Kansai Airports group aims to maximize the potential of the three airports, for the benefit of the communities they serve.
