KIX T1 Renovation

Opening of 4F international security checkpoints ahead of the grand opening More comfortable and streamlined security checks with expanded area

Kansai Airports is pleased to announce that part of the international security checkpoints on the 4th floor of Terminal 1 building at Kansai International Airport (KIX), currently under renovation, will begin operation on Tuesday, September 3, 2024, ahead of the grand opening.

The new international security checkpoints will create a more open and spacious environment by consolidating the three previous checkpoints into one and expanding the area. Additionally, the introduction of longer smart lanes and an increased number of lanes enables more stress-free and streamlined security checks.

The T1 renovation aims to expand the international terminal capacity of KIX, enhance the airside area (post-security checkpoints) and improve passenger experiences in anticipation of further increases in international flight traffic in the Kansai region. Upon the grand opening, scheduled for spring 2025, we will also open new immigration areas, commercial areas, and international lounges to host customers from around the world to the "Osaka-Kansai Expo" to be held in the same year, as the gateway to the Kansai region.

Kansai Airports Group will continue to work with all stakeholders to enhance the functionality of KIX, welcoming both domestic and international customers, and will continuously prioritize safety and security throughout the renovation work.

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





New international departure area after T1 renovation





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

Review of Phase 1 (Completed on October 26, 2022)


- Optimized international/domestic layout
 - Increased international stands (34 -> 39)
- Opened new domestic area
 - Domestic departures consolidated into one place
 - Opened 6 stores in the airside
 - Common lounge opened for passengers eligible to access ANA and JAL lounges

Review of Phase 2 (Completed on December 5, 2023)


• Centralized departure immigration area

- Centralized north and south departure immigration areas to create a warm, inviting space that embodies the essence of Japan
- The largest walk-through duty free at an international airport in Japan
 - Large 2,500m² duty free shop with a rich product lineup of classic souvenirs and brands appearing for the first time in duty free shop in Japan
 - Introduced pick-up counters for pre-ordered items and a system to place orders for confectionary through dedicated devices
 - Concept: Nature & Culture Harmony (Harmony between Japanese unique nature and culture)

• PLAZA & 4MOOD


- PLAZA has a relaxing waiting space, providing a place for the last scene to leave strong memories of travel and KIX
- Mood area offers restaurants and shops, where customers can spend time according to their mood







Phase 3: International security checkpoint on 4F

- Consolidate and expand international security checkpoint on 4F
- Faster, more comfortable and smoother security inspection with additional smart lanes
- The central area to open on September 3, 2024, ahead of the grand opening

Phase 3: Arrival immigration on 3F

- Relocate arrival immigration area to 3F, providing open atmosphere during immigration procedures
- Integrate operation through connecting corridors
- Redesign layout for smooth immigration process






Phase 3: International security checkpoint on 4F

Queuing management system

- Introduced for the first time in Japan
- A system that automatically controls flapper gates to switch waiting lines by utilizing real-time data of the passenger flow. The system enables passengers to be automatically guided to the security inspection lanes automatically and efficiently according to the number of passengers and their flow.






Phase 3: International lounge

- International lounge to be renovated and consolidated on 3F
- Shared lounge for passengers eligible to access the lounge and flying with airlines operating at T1
- Provide more spacious environment by improving space efficiency
- Aiming to create one-and-only lounge, two types of lounges will be opened: Business lounge: Under the theme of "ancient city and urban city" Premium lounge: More luxurious feel for the top class



Phase 3: New commercial area

- A total of 13 stores will open in 3 locations: International departure area on 4F, international arrival area on 3F, and the Tasty Street food court on 2F
- Stores that meet a wide range of customer needs, including food, beverage, retail, duty free, and service facilities
